Stay Informed

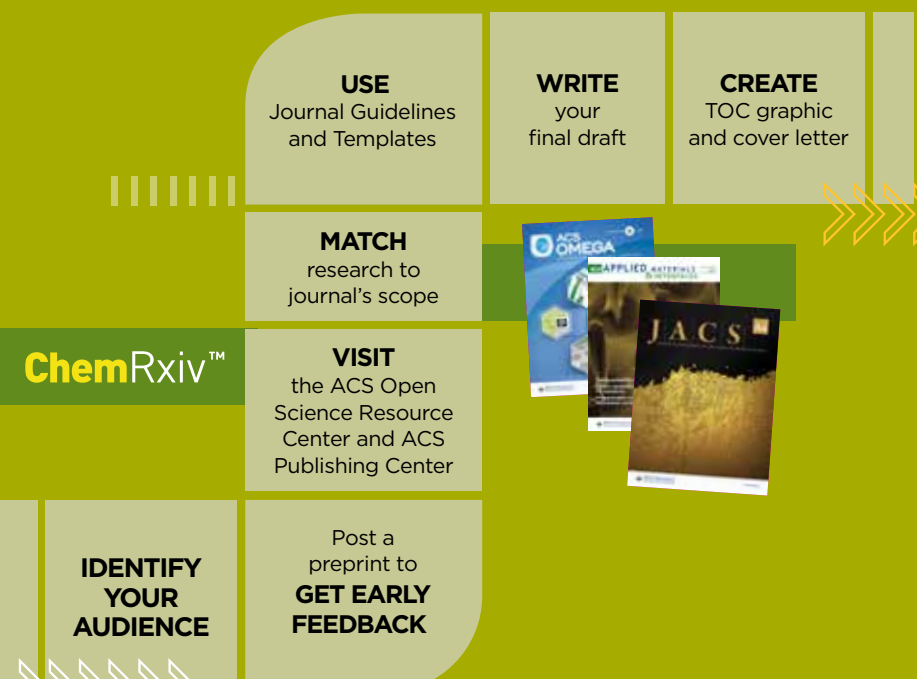
Science never stands still. Keeping up to date on what's published in your field, and where, will help both your research and your writing.

Take advantage of all the ACS Publications resources that are available to help you stay informed.



Select a Journal

Your decision on where to submit should be based on the journal's scope, your funder or institution's requirements etc—not just Impact Factor. Matching your research with the right audience will help you maximize your impact. Pay close attention to the journal's guidelines to help expedite handling of your submission.



Submit Your Manuscript

You've chosen your journal, followed the author guidelines, and completed your manuscript. Now it's time to submit.

Manuscripts submitted to an ACS journal are first checked by the Journal Editorial Office. Next they are pre-screened by the Editor-in-Chief for scope and significance. An Associate Editor then selects appropriate experts for peer review.



Get Reviewed

During submission, you will be asked to provide a list of recommended reviewers. The editors will take this list into consideration and will invite other experts if the article goes out for peer review.

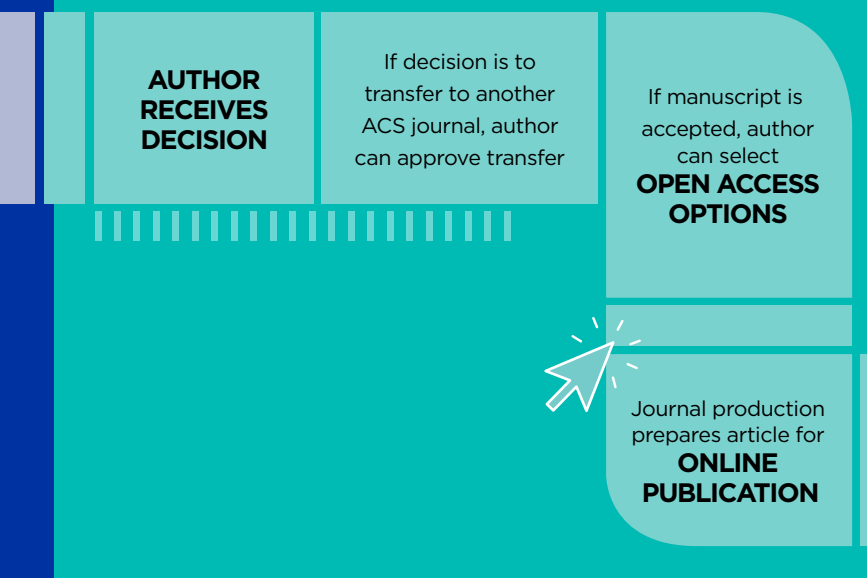
Your work will be thoroughly reviewed by at least three active researchers with the goal of validating and improving the content prior to publication. You may be asked to revise your manuscript or perform additional experiments. Your manuscript could also be rejected at this point.



Publish Your Article

Hopefully, your manuscript has been accepted for publication. If so, congratulations! While ACS journals follow a rigorous review process, they also have some of the fastest publication times in their respective fields.

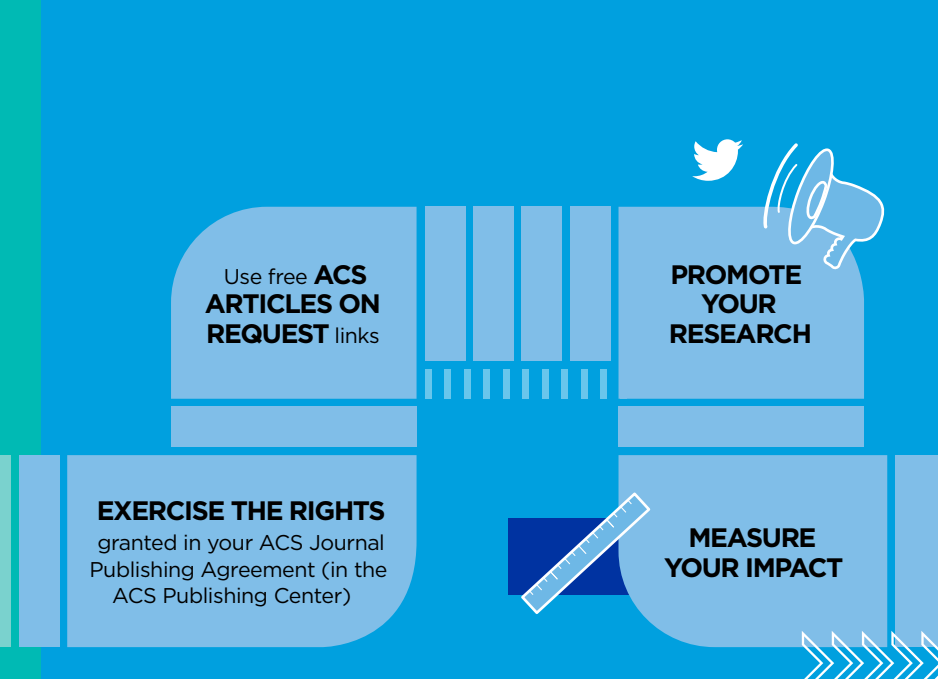
Check to see if your funder or institution requires open access publication. Visit ACSOpenScience.org to search for your institution and to find out whether you are eligible for Article Publishing Charge (APC) support through an ACS Read + Publish Agreement. Remember that choosing to make your research open access could expand your reach.



Share Your Research

When authors take action to share their research with the global scientific community, they help maximize its impact.

Publishing open access makes it easy to share your work widely, expanding your network and opening you up to new collaborators and funders. Don't forget to promote your research (and your data) on social media, at conferences, and through scholarly communication networks.

ACS Journal Publishing Agreement

Corresponding authors must review and sign the ACS Journal Publishing Agreement ahead of online publication.

ACS Certified Deposit

If you publish open access under an ACS license, ACS Publications will submit the final published article for deposit to repositories, while also maintaining and providing records to authors to track deposits.

ACS Articles on Request

With ACS Articles on Request, corresponding authors receive a shareable link for up to 50 free e-prints of the final published article during the first 12 months following online publication.

Unique Identifiers

All submitting authors must link their ORCID iD in ACS Paragon Plus, which enhances the discoverability of published research. ACS Publications also supports the Open Funder Registry Tool and Ringgold ID to streamline publishing data and enhance transparency.
